Two important things to start the year 2024...

CENSUS 2024

The Scout Association has set some different deadlines this year for the completion of the annual census in both timings and the information that is needed to be completed. At the last Group Lead Volunteers meeting in November some early information was shared and now the Census Codes have been distributed it is time to start – if you have not received your Census Code, please get intouch with Shelly.

What do you need to do?

Section Team Leaders have a part to play, alongside the Group Lead Volunteer (or Group Administrator) who completes the online census submission. Here is the information that we are asked to complete in full wherever possible, in addition to the age information that we always collect for each section:

- Ethnicity
 Religion
 Disability

 Please complete and only use "prefer not to say" option if you cannot source the information
- Constitutions Everyone now has an adopted constitution following the work for the 2023 AGMs.

When are the deadlines?

Completion dates are as follows:

- 20 December 2023 The Census Site will open for input (note: there is no need to wait until 31 January 2024)
- 14 January 2023 Approvals open for District sign-off
- 7 February 2023 District approvals close for County to have one week to approve the data
- 14 February 2023 National closure of the Census Site

How much is the cost of membership for 2024?

Fees per young person are set as follows:

- HQ levy is £37.50 including early payment reduced fee (this is an increase of £1.50 on the fee for 2023)
- County levy is £12.50 (this is an increase of 50p on the fee for 2023)
- The District levy is not set by the Board of Trustees until their meeting on 9 January when the budget for 2024/25 will be signed off, including if there will be any subsidy available this year for young leaders. For guidance, last year the District levy was £6.50. Overall, the membership fee will be not less than £56.50.

Payments will be due to be paid to the District with funds cleared by 31 March 2024 in order to qualify for the 50p per head discount from Scouting HQ and the final Census Fee due will be circulated on 10 January 2024.

Please be in touch with Shelly if you need any help with completing this years Census. The Programme Lead for Explorers, Sarah, has already sent out a data collection form for Explorer information which will be used to complete the Census on behalf of the Explorer Units, no online data entry is required by the Explorer Teams.

SAFEGUARDING & THE NEW YELLOW CARD

As you will have seen from your HQ communications, the new Yellow Card and Process for Direct Referral to the HQ Safeguarding Team starts from 1 January 2024.

What do you need to do?

Use the new process from the new year. If your Scout Group has not ordered copies of the Yellow Card resources (cards, poster and additional NSPCC poster) do not worry, Shelly will have supplies in stock to provide for you all.
