A troop was listed at Ormesby in 1916, led by Scoutmaster Lady Margaret Vincent, but no formal records exist.

The scout group re-opened in 1972 led by Group Scout Leader J. Huggins, Scout Leader W. G. Turner and Cub Scout Leader Mrs. S. Baker.

The group re-registered as Sea Scouts in 1974 and by 1986 was dormant.

Re-opening in 1991 under Group Scout Leader Peter Ransom, with Beaver leader Ruth Kelt and Cub Leader Richard Priest the group closed again in 2007.
