There are no formal records of the troop for 1914.

The group was registered in 1919 under Scoutmaster S. M. G. Whiley with 16 Scouts. In 1922 a Wolf Cub pack was registered under Cubmaster Charles J. Woodrow with 18 Wolf Cubs.

The group was one of the five groups that operated during World War II.

The group was sponsored by Gorleston Parish Church and met at a hut on Riverside Road and the Church Rooms on the High Street, Gorleston. The group relocated to the Shrublands Youth Centre in Gorleston in 1968.

In 1969 the 10th and 19th Gt. Yarmouth amalgamated to form the 1st Gorleston.

There are no formal records of the troop for 1915.

The troop was registered in 1923, however laid dormant most years until 1928, when under Group Scoutmaster L. G. Durrant, the group numbered 16 Scouts and 24 Wolf Cubs. The group closed again in 1930.

The group re-opened under Group Scoutmaster Father George Orr in 1961 with 7 Wolf Cubs and 12 Scouts. The group closed for the last time in 1964.
