These included an open-top bus, a holiday camp double bicycle, a boat, a shopping trolley, the Gorleston lifeboat, the seafront holiday road train, and a replica of the 1911 Yarmouth design for a trek cart.

The lantern ended its journey at 01:00 on Great Yarmouth Seafront, where a group of Scouts built sandcastles throughout the night, whilst leaders spent time talking about their Scouting adventures.

At dawn on the morning of 1st August everyone took part in a sunrise ceremony on the beach.
