#### CENSUS.

The site is open, and I would encourage all GLV's to be entering information as soon as possible please. I will as in previous years be reviewing all data and together, we must meet the following deadlines: **By Friday 31 January** – Groups and District to complete entries onto system at the latest.

By Friday 7 February – Sign-off by District.
By Friday 14 February – Sign-off by County.
By Friday 21 March – All fees must be made (and bank cleared) to the District for payment to County by 1 April.
Remember that ALL members who will be Invested by 14 February must be declared on the Census.

### YOUNG LEADERS.

33 Young Leaders were registered on the census 2024. From Census 2025 the subsidy will be staged to relate to the completion of the Young Leader training scheme modules as notified at the AGM:

100% completion of YL Belt = 50% subsidy by district. Module A to 50% completion of YL Belt = 25% subsidy. Scout Groups are asked to fund the remainder of the membership fee for Yls.

**Remember:** You need to register Young Leaders as soon as they start working with a section. YLs have five months to complete Module A and a YL should not work with their old troop for 12-months, but can work with other sections.
